



# **Seaford Invitational Karate** **Championships 2012** **REPORT AND RESULTS**



Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> June 2012 saw Seaford Karate Club host the fifth Invitational Karate tournament at the Downs Leisure Centre. With entries slightly down on last year the hall was still full of competitors and spectators looking forward to some exciting events ahead. With good size categories all competitors would need to be at their best with plenty of competition ahead.

Our Chief Referee was again the very experienced Ben Brown (ASKA) ably assisted by a team of voluntary referees, judges and time-keepers for the day. The first event up saw the weapons kata take centre stage. Jatinder Ram from SKO Southall won the event for a second year running taking the first gold of the day with double Sai followed by Tokon Kai's young Nat Hearn with Nunchuka taking second place for silver. The bronze medal was won by Matthew Delaloye from Seaford, performing Bo.

The team kata event soon followed and Debi Steven's FSKA West London club took gold in the novice kata with Seaford taking both silver and bronze medals. The intermediate team kata category saw the Seaford 'C' team take the gold medal with Heian Godan with JKR-UK Brighton taking the silver medal and bronze going to FSKA West London. The Senior team kata was won by the Seaford 'A' team performing Gojushiho Sho with Seaford 'B' taking silver with a strong Bassai Dai.

The first individual event of the day saw the under 7 years old kata. Sreeram Premkumar (24.4) from BASK out-performed the other competitors to win the gold, with team mate Vinushkaran Yasotharan (24.3) in second and Jack Collyer (23.8) from FSKA London winning the bronze medal. As always all the children who take part in the kata events went home with a medal for participating. In the 7-8 years old Novice to 8th Kyu division FSKA West London took all the medals with Edward Newton (25.8) taking the gold medal, Luca Barnes (25.5) in silver and Trajan Nader (25.2) scooping the bronze against 13 other competitors. In the 7-8 years old 7th Kyu and above Sanje Ramesh (24.8 BASK) brushed aside the opposition to win gold with Eastbourne's Harry Woolston (24.5 Mushinkan) in second place and Ollie O'Regan (24.5) from CMA Uckfield taking home the bronze medal.

Vainavi Keerthishankar (24.8 BASK) took the gold over two rounds in the 8-10 years old novice to 7<sup>th</sup> kyu in a category of 14 competitors, leaving Arrabi Vasavan (24.3) from BASK in second and Reese Bolton (23.5 FSKA West London) in third.

In the 6<sup>th</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> Kyu division Piranavan Selvamanoharam (25.9 BASK) was impressive over two rounds, winning the gold medal while team mate Gunna Santharasu (25.0) took the silver and Hugo Bernie (24.8) from FSKA took the bronze.

The 8-9 years old 5<sup>th</sup> Kyu and above was won by Lewis Finch performing Heian Godan and Bassai Dai (24.7) to win the gold followed by Luke Weatherfield (24.6), both from Seaford and Nat Hearn (24.5) from Tokon Kai picking up the bronze.

In the boys and girls 11-15 categories novice to 7<sup>th</sup> Kyu event BASK took a clean sweep of the medals. Gold was won by Guruparan Ganeshwaran (25.2) followed by team mate Gajamuken Ganeshwaran (24.9) in Silver and Miruthulan Maivanna (24.8) taking the bronze medal. In the intermediate section 21 competitors battled it out over two rounds which was dominated by Ellie Poulton (25.6) from JKR-UK who won the gold followed by Jothika Rahulotchanan (25.5 BASK) and bronze going to Fenella Lea (25.3) from Seaford.

In the brown belt section Rohan Mathiyalagan (25.1) performed well to beat the other 10 competitors to the gold medal with Younis Awad (25.0) from SKO Southall taking silver and Ben Ashworth (24.5) from Mushinkan in Eastbourne taking bronze.

The Children's black belt section was won over two rounds by Emily Delaloye from Seaford performing Gojushiho Sho (19.4) and Chinte (25.2) scoring a total of 44.6 with Jatinder Ram (43.9) from SKO Southall in Second place followed closely by Reece Tindle (43.7) from Tokon Kai taking bronze.

In the male novice kata Cameron Reilly (48.6) from JKR-UK Brighton took the gold followed by Matthew Melville (48.4) from Seaford and Ralf Rebetge (48.3) from FSKA West London in bronze.

Category 13 saw the male intermediate adults perform with 9 competing. BASK dominated this event over the two rounds with Tarandip Chana (50.0) winning the gold medal. The silver medal went to Kubendran Ramesh (49.3) BASK and bronze going to Arulananthasamy (48.9) BASK London.

The female intermediate kata was won by Shanthy Rahulochanan (43.0) from BASK with Rebecca Tedder (39.7) from Mushinkan, Eastbourne in silver, while in the Female Senior Kata Sarah Davis (44.1) from JKR-UK Brighton won the gold over two rounds leaving Ellie Reynolds (42.8 CMA Uckfield) picking up the silver.

In the Male Brown belt kata Matthew Delaloye (49.9) from Seaford performed Enpi 25.0 and Gojushiho Sho 24.9 to take the gold medal with Jonathan Hubble (48.1) FSKA West London in second and Lewis Finch (47.8 Seaford) picking up the bronze medal.

The male senior kata saw Sellathurai Ganeshalingam (Chief Instructor of BASK) with Gojushiho sho and Nijushiho scoring a total of 49.8 while silver went to Lee Finch (49.6) from Seaford performing Kanku Dai and Enpi and bronze to Callum Ware from JKR-UK Ryobu Kai with Nijushiho and Jion (49.2).

The Masters open kata saw Sensei Ganesh take a his second gold medal of the day performing Jion and Enpi scoring 49.3 with Alex Eley (48.3) from Tokon Kai taking silver and Kubendran Ramesh (47.9) from BASK taking bronze medal in kata.

After a short break for the referees, the kumite kicked off with the Men's Team Kumite. The final saw the home team, Seaford, faced an enthusiastic team from the British Academy of Shotokan Karate (BASK). Seaford's Lee Finch won the first fight 5-1 against Tarandip Chana, before Kieran Young lost to Ash Kanda the BASK fighter 0-2. In the final, with lots of crowd support, Seaford's third fighter Chris Maulkin took the early lead and quickly extended it to win the clash 9-1 against Anik Islam to give Seaford an overall 2-1 win. The Seaford team took the gold and BASK finished with silver.

The children's kumite started with the boys and girls 7 years and below. With 16 competitors Vinushkaran Yasotharan (BASK) won 8-0, 9-5, 8-3 to stamp his authority on the event winning Gold beating Jack Collyer (FSKA) 6-3 in the final. This left Georgia Cotter and Trajan Nader, from FSKA West London, picking up the bronze medals.

In the boys and girls 8-9 years and below under 4'3" kumite FSKA's Anojan Ginaneswaran narrowly defeated a spirited Milly Cohn-Fanuntza in the final to lift the gold medal. Bronze went to Timon Schagon (Seaford) and Narrotom Pathmaseelan from BASK..

In the over 4'3" division Sanje Ramesh beat off 18 other fighters in his division to run out the winner 5-2, 2-1, 1-0 & 3-2 with Lewis Rees FSKA in second and equal third going to Hugo Bernie (FSAK) and Piranavan Selvamanoharan (BASK).

In the 10-12 years old under 4'10" Younis Awad (SKO Southall) took a fantastic gold in a large group of 22 beating Jenaththan Vijayakumar from BASK in the final. Bronze medals went to Max Smith from Seaford and Prakash Sasitharan (BASK) for their brave effort.

In the over 4'10" kumite Isaac Wiley from Seaford won his rounds 4-0, 4-1, 2-1 and then the final 9-0 against Thomas Cotter from FSKA West London. Thomas Holloway (FSKA) and Jack Smith from Tokon Kai shared the third place bronze medal.

In the Boys 13-15 years old under 5'3" kumite category saw Guruparan Ganeshwaran from BASK win his rounds 8-1 & 5-4 and then defeat Seaford's John Schagon in a close final 4-3 to decide the gold and silver medals. Jatinder Ram (SKO Southall) and Miruthulan Manivanna (BASK) shared the bronze.

In the over 5'3" kumite Seaford's Mark Browning and Kallum Harding faced each other in a tactical final, after sweeping aside all before them. Mark got the early point and held on for the win and take the gold medal while Kallum took Silver. Mujib Salem and Jamie Lashley both FSKA went home with bronze medals.

In the girls 13-15 years old kumite Helen Smith from Tokon Kai beat Karishma Vijay from SKO Southall in the final with Jess Patrick and Beth Evans both from Tokon Kai sharing the bronze medals.

The Senior Female kumite produced an aggressively competitive final between Sarah Davis (JKR-UK Brighton) and Vicki Swinge from Tokon Kai. Sarah edged the contest to finish with the Gold medal winning 2-1 and silver going to Vicki.

The male novice and intermediate events was won for a second year by Ash Kanda from BASK beating team mate Tarandip Chana (BASK) in the final 4-3. The bronze medal was shared by Mathew Meville (Seaford) and Richard Pione (Tokon Kai).

In the under 21 years kumite Matthew Delaloye from Seaford dominated the field winning the final 8-0 with some impressive techniques beating Callum Ware (JKR-UK) from Brighton into second for a silver medal. Matthew Melville (Seaford) and Cameron Reilly (JKR-UK) picked up the bronze medals.

The male lightweight senior kumite saw a final contested between Matt Jones from Tokon Kai and Callum Ware JKR-UK Brighton. A close encounter saw Matt edge the fight 1-0 and take home the gold medal, leaving Callum with a second silver.

The heavyweights kumite category was won for a second consecutive year by Seaford's Lee Finch defeating Chris Maulkin from Red Oak Karate Club, Lewes, in the final 4-2. Both fighters came through earlier rounds winning their fights (Chris 7-4 & 8-1 – Lee 2-1) before Lee got his hands on the gold medal. Bronze medals going to Suky Saggi (SKO London) and Jonathan Hubble FSKA West London.

The Masters Kumite for the over 40's saw Alex Eley beat his Tokon Kai club mate Chris Patrick in the final 7-1, to finish off a very successful day.

The day was finished just before 5.00pm, and nearly everyone was on their way home smiling.
